A bright orange flag, no smaller than 12"x12" and visible from all directions, must be displayed during the entire time a skier or tuber is outside your boat. The flag is not to be on display at any other times. (We found that an old necktie and rubber band will cover the flag when we are not towing the grandkids.)

Park Boat Dock Information

If you own a boat dock in Park One or Park Two and want to sell it, please remember that there is a waiting list for purchasers. Anyone wishing to sell a dock must contact the Association Office to obtain a copy of the waiting list. Docks must be sold to Eagle Point Bay Property Owners who are also Eagle Point Bay Association Members. Dock owners are responsible for keeping the docks in good condition and providing liability insurance coverage information to the Association each year.

Park Rules:

- Always lock the gates after entering and when leaving the parks.
 - No dogs are allowed in the parks.
 - Children must be supervised by an adult when in the parks.
 - Weapons are never allowed in the parks.
 - Obey all Illinois and federal laws!

Don't forget to mark your docks and water equipment with your subdivision number and lot number. (EPB is subdivision number 14. For lot 372, the correct identification number is 14-372.)
