The church is adversely affected by the impact of the new militancy that has engulfed the whole of West Cameroon. My brethren, Cameroon is again in the spotlight of international attention for all the wrong reasons! Access to the internet has not only been criminalized but geographically unavailable in many towns and cities, Limbe inclusive.

The ban on internet communication imposed by the government of Cameroon has disrupted certain activities of the church in the country as a whole. The effects of the disconnection of our cities from the world wide web on our evangelism programs of the church have not been easy to endure. Our preaching work on Eden Radio has
