

Over One Hundred Years Ago

The year is 1917. What a difference a century makes! Here are some U.S. statistics for the Year 1917:

- ▶ The average life expectancy for men was 47 years.
- ▶ Fuel for cars was sold in drug stores only.
- ▶ Only 14 percent of the homes had a bathtub.
- ▶ Only 8 percent of the homes had a telephone.
- ▶ The maximum speed limit in most cities was 10 mph.
- ▶ The tallest structure in the world was the Eiffel Tower.
- ▶ The average US wage in 1910 was 22 cents per hour.
- ▶ The average US worker made between \$200 and \$400 per year.
- ▶ A competent accountant could expect to earn \$2000 per year.
- ▶ A dentist \$2,500 per year.
- ▶ A veterinarian between \$1,500 and \$4,000 per year.
- ▶ And, a mechanical engineer about \$5,000 per year.
- ▶ More than 95 percent of all births took place at home
- ▶ Ninety percent of all Doctors had NO COLLEGE EDUCATION! Instead, they attended so-called medical schools, many of which were condemned in the press AND the government as "substandard."
- ▶ Sugar cost four cents a pound.
- ▶ Eggs were fourteen cents a dozen.
- ▶ Coffee was fifteen cents a pound.
- ▶ Most women only washed their hair once a month and used Borax or egg yolks for shampoo.
- ▶ Canada passed a law that prohibited poor people from entering into their country for any reason.
- ▶ The Five leading causes of death were:
 - 1. Pneumonia and influenza
 - 2. Tuberculosis
 - 3. Diarrhea

- 4. Heart disease
- 5. Stroke
- ▶ The American flag had 45 stars.
- ▶ The population of Las Vegas, Nevada was only 30.
- ▶ Crossword puzzles, canned beer, and iced tea hadn't been invented yet.
- ▶ There was neither a Mother's Day nor a Father's Day.
- ▶ Two out of every 10 adults couldn't read or write.

And, only 6 percent of all Americans had graduated from high school.


- ▶ Marijuana, heroin, and morphine were all available over the counter at local corner drugstores.
- ▶ Back then pharmacists said, "Heroin clears the complexion, gives buoyancy to the mind, regulates the stomach, bowels, and is, in fact, a perfect guardian of health!" (Shocking?)
- ▶ Eighteen percent of households had at least one fulltime servant or domestic help.
- ▶ There were about 230 reported murders in the ENTIRE U.S.A.!

- I. It is satisfying to our selfishness (self)

 Appreciation comes with comparison
 - A. Fire (Matthew 5:22, fiery gehena, illus. v.29-30)
 - B. Destruction (Matthew 7; 10:28 where God destroys)
 - C. Torments (Luke 16:23ff)
 - 1. flame (v.24)
 - 2. memory and torment in flame (v.25)
 - 3. a great gulf (v.26, depicting an eternal state)
 - 4. Deuteronomy 32:2; Job 11:8; Psalm 9:17; 86:13
 - 5. Isaiah 5:14 hell enlargeth; Isaiah 14:9 hell moveth
- II. It is satisfying to our curiosity (Psalm 104:2)
 - A. The firmament (Genesis 1:6)
 - B. Stars named and numbered (Psalm 147:4)
 - What Job knew about the stars (Job 9:9; 38:31)
 - C. Jeremiah 31:37 the awe of heaven and earth
- III. It is satisfying to our faith commitment (2 Timothy 4:6-8)

 It is Faith Based
 - A. A longing (2 Timothy 4:6-8)
 - B. A confidence willingness to be absent (2 Corinthians 5:8)
 - C. A belief (John 3:16; Psa 23)


When you know the truths about eternity, you find an excitement about Heaven. Are you saved? Will you be in Heaven? Do you have an excitement for Heaven?
