## Who should attend?

- The person(s) responsible for developing an intelligence capacity in any state, local or tribal law enforcement agency regardless of the individual's rank or agency size
- Non-sworn personnel designated with this responsibility may also attend
- Specialized law enforcement agencies are included (e.g., Transit Police, campus law enforcement (public or private); Parks and Wildlife; Corrections agencies, etc.)



## What are the costs?

- There is no cost for the training or resources
- Lodging will be provided to participants who travel 50 miles or more to the training site (typically a hotel). Limited rooms will be available on a first-come/first-served basis
- All participants will be provided:
  - A continental breakfast
  - A working lunch
  - Morning and afternoon refreshments
  - A networking reception
