November 2016 Mission Report by Abasiama in Cameroon

The country of Cameroon is still precarious but we still have to preach the Bible in to the people of Cameroon. In November we stepped up our effort in every domain of our preaching work in Limbe. We did this to glorify God as we sought to save souls. Was it an easy month during which to preach? Not at all. Did we reach out with the gospel to as many people as we possibly could? Absolutely. How many were encouraged to visit the church? We had many visitors in the church during the month. Any conversions? There was none.

Then how was our effort blessed in the month in question? In several ways.

First, we have been able to spread the gospel by radio and television. My teeming radio listeners were glad to also meet us as we preached on HiTV on the third Sunday of November. This fearless effort is widening our audience and is constantly providing people with the equal opportunity to know the Lord and believe in Him. Our evangelism work in these studios has generated the much-needed awareness for the gospel and the church of Christ in the southwest of the country in particular. Without our contact information announced on air, we are frequently greeted by strangers who desire to know more about the church of Christ. We

are still studying with them, and we have never lost the hope that some of them will be converted by the Lord.

As we reported last month on the loss of tranquility in Cameroon due to a misunderstanding among a diversity of interest groups in the country, the situation is still lingering though with a reduced intensity. Children have returned to schools but with a suppressed fear of attacks by angry youths of the two English-speaking regions of the Cameroon. We are praying that God will save us from the tragedy of armed conflict in the country. It is a country in which many people, especially the youth, have lost hope of any desirable future. This accounts for the unbridled desire among our people to migrate to other countries in search of a "better life". Nevertheless, not less than 22 million people are still living in Cameroon. With this population, we have many souls to preach to. We have a need to plant more congregations in places where the truth about Jesus has not been heard in this same Cameroon. That is why we are seriously involved in building the growing congregation in Limbe to be strong enough to serve as a springboard to help weak congregations around us, and with a vision to establish others where none exists.

We have resumed work on our church building after some negotiations with the ministry of Lands and Survey. By the grace of God we hope that the resumption of construction will not be interrupted again. We are set to take the work on the auditorium to another level. as we draw closer to the end of this year, we are already assessing the extent of progress in this aspect of church growth.

My son is still in need of your supplication. He has a bit of relief and he is preparing for his exams as their school is preparing for their first term holiday.

The urge to thank God for your partnership with us in the gospel will never diminish. It is unbelievable that so soon we have spent 10 years together in reaching out to the nations with the good news of Christ in a world horrified with endless culture of war, disease and dying. We sincerely are grateful to God for joining us in this beautiful work of preaching. Thank you for your role as a sponsor of our gospel outreach. You have undoubtedly liberated many people from ignorance by your support. You have brought the message of salvation into the homes of lost people in Cameroon. You have led a great number of people to the Church

of Christ. That is why it will never be redundant to pray that God will continue to bless you, and your families, and congregations as you labor in the great commission.
