

My wife and my two boys send greetings to you all, looking for some day they will see some of you here on earth, if not when we meet to heaven. We appreciate each and every one of you for your prayers and support. May our Good Lord be with you all.

The month of October was an interesting month, because it marks the beginning of the end of the year. It starts the last quarter of the year, where everything seems to be on the rush. It was a pleasant month that had its sorrows as well. My wife's cousin lost her husband in a car crash. Leaving behind four small kids. It was a moment of pains and sorrow for the immediate and the extended family members. Nigerian economy is going down day by day. We are asking God to help us understand the lesson

He wants us to learn in this hardship. It is obvious that our leaders do not know what to do, to get us out of recession. Kidnapping is on the increase in addition to the challenges of Islamic militants.

Our weekly evangelism outreach at Foron Mission was intensified in the month of October. We made effort to reach people of different groups, the young and the old, literate and illiterate. At the end of the day, 6 of them accepted Christ and were baptized for the remission of their sins. After the baptism, they were so grateful and told us that no one has ever preached to them. That was why they were surprised that we came to them. Possibly, they have been considered as headstrong people. I pray God will work in them. Surprising enough, soon after their baptism, their family began attacking them, discouraging them from coming for worship. Please, join us in prayers for these boys.
