SEPTEMBER 2016 REPORT FROM CAMEROON BY ABASIAMA

In the beginning of the month of September we aspired to do our missionary work in Cameroon with a renewed sense of commitment. Our aspiration later proved to be a huge success. We started out fearlessly to spread the word of God amidst many unbelievers in our towns and communities. Our endeavor in this regard has once again proven itself to be worth the while. As expected, great results have emerged and we have come back rejoicing, bringing in the sheaves. Indeed, we give God the glory for His incredible blessings upon our effort to remain fishers of men.

Let me first highlight some of the encouraging outcomes of our evangelism efforts in September. As usual, the sower went out to sow. He took advantage of every opportunity to preach the gospel to the lost and to the saved. Some of the seed definitely fell on unproductive hearts. Hearts that rejected our message outnumbered the good ones. Thank God the story did not end in rejection. It also tells of those who gladly accepted the call to salvation through our

gospel. These receptive hearts responded positively to God's plan of salvation. They keenly paid attention to the gospel delivered in its simplicity. And by His grace, we are now celebrating the conversions of two young men.



The first to open his heart to the gospel we preached in September was a fine young man named Rene Anjah. Rene is twenty-one years old. On September 4, he sent a text message saying that he wanted to be baptized before he resumed the new school year. He had been a faithful listener of our preaching on Eden Radio. He was immersed into Christ on September 5, 2016. He has since returned to school in a town called Lebialem. I have connected him with the church in that town where he is schooling. He will continue to worship there until when he returns to Limbe at the end of the term.



The second new convert of September is Joseph Boseh. He is resident in Sokolo in Limbe. He too had been an ardent listener of LET THE BIBLE SPEAK. Joseph had to finally yield to the master's tender call to repentance. So it came to pass in the second week of September that this tall teenager thought it wise to make hay while the sun shine at his age of 17. He is now a member of the Washing Point congregation. We thank God that no family member is reported to be trying to hinder his membership of the church, at least for now. Notwithstanding, he needs our prayers as does brother Rene, so that they may overcome the various temptations on their way to grow in their faith. We are expecting more conversions even as we plan to do more in the work of preaching in Cameroon. That was the evangelism aspect of the story of September.

The Church in Limbe is working tirelessly to move the congregation on in terms of the spiritual life of the brethren. Our Bible study on Wednesday is a forum for growth in the congregation's knowledge of God's truth. The assembly is moving in the right direction with a tremendous momentum in the work of edifying the saints while catering for the needs of the underprivileged among us. With little resources, the church is determined to continue to maintain the Radio preaching slot on Eden Radio because it has been a wonderful medium to reach out to the people of our city and its environs. Our Building project is equally engaging our best physical and fiscal resources. We believe it is worth the effort. Our unwavering hope is that many great things will happen in our lifetime as a congregation in this generation and in the ones that will follow. That is the reason why we work so hard as if everything depends on us, and at the same time pray so hard as if everything depends on God. It is also interesting to observe that the sad mood of the congregation occasioned by the passing of Sister Henrietta is slowly disappearing. Brother Edmond himself is gradually coping with the reality of being single again. Please remember the church whenever you have a little talk with Jesus.



Appreciation is next. First, I want to use this opportunity to appreciate Dr. Holloway on this year's occasion of Teachers' Day. UNESCO proclaimed 5 October to be World Teachers' Day some 22 years ago. Since then, the recognition of the role of teachers in every society has been heightened by the celebration of the International Day for the Teachers. Unarguably, the responsibilities of teachers have been more enormous compared to their privileges or rights. I believe it is important to appreciate our teachers because of their indispensable work of education the citizens. I also dedicate the Day to my Bible school lecture, Dr. Tom for his excellent work with all

students of the School of Biblical Studies in Nigeria all these years. We shall forever honor and respect the work of our teachers by celebrating the profession and praying that respect and reward for teachers become the natural order of things in every nation.

And also to our partners all over the world, the ones who serve the cause of the gospel by donating their money to help support preachers, we say thank you. We appreciate your concern for the great commission in Cameroon. We sincerely thank you all for sharing in our burden to save souls in Africa. Thank you for being interested in our missions.
