The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Good Shepherd in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord, as He says, gives not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sin. In joyful obedience to the clear teaching of our Lord Jesus those are invited to His table who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. They show forth His death until He comes. Because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and so are unable to receive the Sacrament are invited to meditate on God's Word in the distribution hymns and pray for the day when divisions will have ceased. You may also come up to the rail and receive a baptismal blessing. Signify this by crossing your hands over your chest. If you have any questions, please feel free to talk to Pastor.

Pastor, what is the origin of Matins and Vespers?

They can be traced back in the history of the Church to the early Christian observance of the Jewish hours of prayer. Acts 3:1; 10:9.

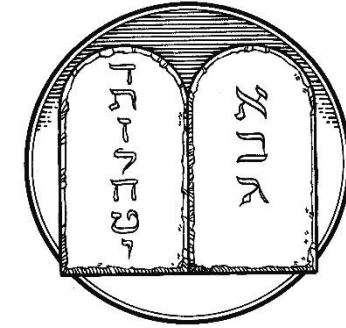
Which were the hours of prayer observed by the Jews?

The third, sixth and ninth hours of the day (reckoning from sunrise to sunset). Psalm 55:17; Daniel 6:10.

Were additional hours observed by the Christians?

Yes, very early in the history of the Church, six hours of prayer were appointed, then seven, and in the sixth century eight, which is the number still observed in the cloisters of the Roman Church.

LWML Mites - Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of "mites" — offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS. Mite Box contributions amount to millions of dollars that fund district and national [mission grants](#) and implement the LWML program. The national LWML convention voted to support \$2,221,176.15 in mission grants for the 2021-2023 biennium. MN South LWML is supporting \$198,750 in mission grants. We will put out a big Mite box on the second Sunday of each month and ask everyone to prayerfully consider giving their mites to support these mission grants.
