

Even Pentecost, whose color is red (for the Holy Spirit), was once known as White-Sunday, from which the traditional term Whitsunday comes. Feast days of saints who were not martyred, such as St. John and St. Mary Magdalene, also employ white, signifying the purity of sainthood.
