Announcements

The seasons of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter are most appropriately adorned in white, for they commemorate the incarnation and the resurrection of our Lord, which are the greatest of all commemorations. These first-class feasts are also feasts of our Lord, who is Himself the spotless Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. In Isaiah, the declaration of God is, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool" (1:18). The purity of Christ, therefore, is also to be understood as the purity which becomes ours through faith in Him. For He by His merit and sacrifice has obtained for us this purity which is His own, and He gives this purity to us by the proclamation and distribution of the forgiveness of sins through His name. In this way, we become pure and white as He is. Thus it is right to adorn the feasts of Him who is our Lord with white as He is. Thus it is right to adorn the feasts of Him who is our Lord with white, for they indicate not only His purity, but the purity which belongs by faith to His own faithful flock, received by the means of salvation offered and given in the feast of salvation, the Mass.
