Announcements

Red is, of course, the color of fire which makes it on Pentecost the color of the Holy Spirit's fire resting on the apostle' heads. Red is also used, however, to commemorate any saints who were martyred, for red is the color of blood. This too is related closely to Pentecost, a connection which is often missed. The Pentecostal fire of the Spirit was a token of things to come: these apostles were about to be persecuted severely for preaching the Gospel. Eleven of the Twelve would be martyred for it, and the twelfth, St. John, would be exiled. The Holy Spirit is manifested in the preaching of the Gospel, and a regular result of this manifestation is the same result as occurred in Christ's own ministry. See what happened to Him who said, "the words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life" (St. John 6:63). Behold, He was crucified. Thus there is a repetition of His life seen in the life of faith: when the Christian faith is boldly confessed in the world, there Christians take up their crosses and follow Him, as He said. Small wonder, then, that they have been persecuted, hounded, reproached, and martyred. Small wonder, too, that the color of Pentecost is red
