Announcements

According to widespread tradition it is violet, the color for Lenten sorrows, which is rather to be used for Ash Wednesday as the first day of Lent, and for a Day of Humiliation and Prayer, as for a day of penitential supplications. On Good Friday, it is also traditional to leave the altar bare, following its stripping after the Maundy Thursday celebration of the Sacrament. This tradition would still employ black for the veiling of crosses and images on Good Friday.

Moreover black, as signifying dignity, is the traditional color for the regular clothing of pastors, as well as for the tipper, a long stole-like scarf worn over cassock and surplice to signify the preaching office, especially when the pastor preaches a sermon at times such as Matins and Vespers, when the Sacrament is not offered
