

Churches with arches which ascend to a point at the top are generally called Gothic or neo-gothic. In some Gothic churches, if you stand at the entrance and look down the aisle toward the altar, you can see the ribs in the wall that accentuate these arches, architectural lines that move vertically from the bottom of the ceiling vault to the very top. These ribs seem to fit inside one another as one looks down the aisle, as each successive rib is a little farther away from the one before it, and hence, smaller in appearance. The view is, as it were, of a picture frame within a picture frame within a picture frame, from the first to the last rib. What this suggest to the viewer is a sense of looking into another realm altogether.
