According to the American pledge of allegiance, the flag stands for the republic itself. This is why it is proper for Americans to honor the flag, for the republic is due honor as a nation "under God". All nations are "under God", in that they only exist as nations by God's leave, and also in that their authorities are all "ordained of God" (Rom. 13:1). In America, we accord honor to the flag not only because of this, but also because we recognize the value of America's freedoms, which are a gift of God. Thus it is right for Christians to observe proper flag etiquette: to stand when the flag passes at a parade; to display the flag only during daylight or when lighted; to replace any torn or tattered flag; never to wear a flag as an article of clothing, etc.
