To our visitors and guests:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Good Shepherd in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord, as He says, gives not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sin. In joyful obedience to the clear teaching of our Lord Jesus those are invited to His table who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. They show forth His death until He comes. Because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and so are unable to receive the Sacrament are invited to meditate on God's Word in the distribution hymns and pray for the day when divisions will have ceased. You may also come up to the rail and receive a baptismal blessing. Signify this by crossing your hands over your chest. If you have any questions, please feel free to talk to Pastor.

The color rose, when it is used, is only seen during two days of the year, Sundays set in the midst of the year's two penitential seasons. Rose is accordingly appropriate for the Third Sunday of Advent (*Gaudete*) and for the Fourth Sunday in Lent (*Laetare*). The reason for this usage is that rose is a lightening of the purple hue, and as such a reminder that even in the depths of sorrows or penitence, Christian faith is appropriately joyful, ever mindful of the victory which Christ has obtained for us. These two Sundays are therefore set at the midpoint of the penitential seasons, and the color rose is employed only on the Sundays themselves, and not for the weeks following them. Similarly flowers, which are traditionally absent during Lent, are used on *Laetare* Sunday, as a further reminder of the joy set in the midst of penitential sorrows.

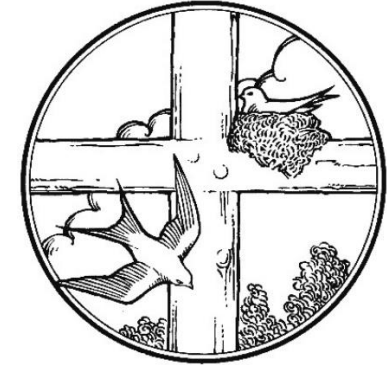
New bookmarks can be found on the resource table that include dates of both testaments, reminders of how to distinguish between law and gospel, and more.
