There is really no more concise and emphatic a Christian confession than “Amen”. This is why it is most appropriate for Christian people to be accustomed to saying this word from the heart at set times during the Mass. The times for *Amens* are spontaneous, however, but are according to set rubrics, in order to preserve good order and propriety in worship, as the Apostle instructs the church, saying, “The spirits of the prophets are subject to the prophets,” and again, “Let all things be done decently and in order” (1 Cor. 14:32, 40). So “Amen” is appropriately said whenever the Pastor blesses the people, whenever the Trinitarian name is invoked, or even at the altar, when the Sacrament is given and received.
