Announcements

To our visitors and guests:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Good Shepherd in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord, as He says, gives not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sin. In joyful obedience to the clear teaching of our Lord Jesus those are invited to His table who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. They show forth His death until He comes. Because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and so are unable to receive the Sacrament are invited to meditate on God's Word in the distribution hymns and pray for the day when divisions will have ceased. You may also come up to the rail and receive a baptismal blessing. Signify this by crossing your hands over your chest. If you have any questions, please feel free to talk to Pastor.

The word Amen is a Hebrew word whose meaning carried over also into Greek, which simply means “truly”. Whenever Jesus’ words, for example, are translated “Truly, truly I say to you,” what is actually found in the Greek original are the words “Amen, amen lego hymin”. This is why the Catechism tells us that what is meant by Amen is “Yes, yes, it shall be so”, or, “This is most certainly true”. For the word in Christian usage is a great emphatic word of confession of the Faith, as it has long been so, dating from the days of Moses. Moses instructed that the people were at various times to say their Amen, and from thenceforth the people of Israel did so instinctively. So when the Levites brought the ark of God and set it in the midst of the tent David had pitched for it, the Levites sang a song of praise recorded in 1 Chronicles 16. When they finished singing, “all the people said, ‘Amen!’ and praised the Lord”. So also, the Psalms are filled with Amens amid songs of praise. In the early church, according to St. Paul (1Cor. 14:16) it was customary for the people to say “Amen” at the giving of thanks, undoubtedly because the church’s form of prayer and Mass followed the patterns set long before in the synagogue by the Sacred Scriptures.
