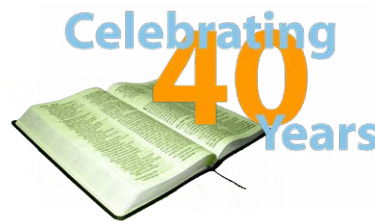


THIS WEEK:

Carried or Buried, Heaven or Hell

And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried (Luke 16:22).

In our American life there are a number of questions we regularly answer. ***Paper or plastic?...Eat in or take out?...Credit or debit?*** These are so familiar that we answer without much thought. But one such question lingers to which getting the right answer is of monumental importance.

In this passage, which is found within Luke 16:19-31, we are presented by the Lord Jesus Christ with a graphic picture of the contrast between the self-worshipping rich man's eternity in hell, and the rest and comfort of the godly beggar man Lazarus.

Both of these men were afforded the opportunity to be saved. Lazarus, in his suffering had come to saving faith, later died, and was carried by angels into heaven. He was comforted by Abraham, (by the way, a very wealthy man who, in contrast to this rich man, received the Words of God). The rich man died, was buried, and found himself in the torments of hell. We see here that eternal rest is a reward for receiving by faith the Truth of God. Eternal torment is a result of rejecting the Truth of God.

The rich man in this passage had lived with a Godly man at his gate, knew his name, yet turned his back on him while fulfilling his own desires and appetites. By his own words, while in torment in hell, the rich man knew that Lazarus was able to testify to his brothers and spare them from hell. Abraham told him that, *If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead.*

Upon death, all will immediately be in either heaven or hell. This is clearly a result of one's response to the Words of God. There is no intermediate opportunity to deal with sin after death. Prayer for the entrance of the dead into heaven is worthless (v.26). Whether born before, during, or after the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our eternal destination is determined by our faith response to Him in this life.

Will you enjoy the honor of being carried directly into heaven, or be buried and find yourself irretrievably in the torments of hell?

The lingering question...***carried, or buried***, which will it be?
