Directions:

1. After folding your Planetary Passport, fill out personal information and add a photo or drawing of yourself in the box.
2. Indicate on the world map, with a star, where you were born.
3. Find people that were born in other countries and ask if you can give them a brief interview.
4. Ask simple questions and record the information on your interview sheet:
 1. What country are you from? Where on the map is that country?
 2. What language(s) do you speak?
 3. What religion do you practice?
 4. Would you be willing to be interviewed by someone in my class for the book project?
(Get their name and phone #. Interview will last for 30-45 minutes.)
5. Ask the person to sign your passport in the correct area and mark birthplace on the map.
6. Ask a few open-ended questions and record the answers on the 'notes' section of your interview sheet.
(These notes may be used by your classmates to determine if they want to interview that person for the book project.)

You may want to ask them about:

- The beauty of the land
- Arts and crafts
- Favorite foods
- Family
- School life
- Amusement and spare time
- What they miss most
- Weather
- Why they came to the U.S.
- Anything else you want to talk about

Nine geographic areas:

Africa, Asia, Caribbean Islands, Central America, Europe, Middle East, North America, Pacific Oceania, South America

Scoring:

- 1 point: For each person you interview
- 1 point: For each language spoke fluently by interviewee
- 1 point: For each religion practiced by interviewee
- 1 point: For each name and phone number of people willing to do longer interview (30-45 min.)
- 5 points: If you interview someone from all of the 9 geographic areas
- 2 points: If you interview someone from 6 out of the 9 geographic areas

Total of 20 points = 2 extra credit points or 2 prize points

Total of 25 points = 3 extra credit points or 3 prize points

Total of 30 points or more = 4 extra credit points or 4 prize points
