ACTIVITIES IN 2020

First Aid is making its first appearance on our course list. Local ambo volunteer, Alison Keene, who has a Certificate IV in First Aid, has kindly offered to run a session on the basics of first aid including CPR.

At the moment this non-certificate course looks like being just one 90-minute session on a Monday in Term 1 at 1 p.m. on a date to be advised. Probably something we all should do.

Meditation for Relaxation is taking a break in Term 1 while leader Anne Smith is away on holidays. Anne is also willing to revisit her **Conscious Ageing** course which was successfully offered for just one term in 2019. It was mainly booked by members of Anne's Meditation class so this time it would require new faces. Register your interest if you would like to do this 8- week program designed to: cultivate wisdom, connect with others, celebrate life.

Each week includes reflection, small group discussion and some individual writing.

Topics include:

Chris wants to remind everyone that these groups are for maintaining your fitness rather than rehabilitation or recovery after health problems.

Hermann Weber will take over **Book Group** duties from Marianne Holliday, and Doreen Hill will take on **Coffee and Chat** from Val Tilbrook. Self-described artaholic, Ann Foster, will be contact person for both Auburn and Burra Art Groups though no doubt Gerald Moore will be attending whenever he can.

Gerald has been a wonderful leader of the Art group since it started out as Pastel Drawing in 2006 meeting in the old portable classrooms behind TAFE.

He quickly proved such an asset to U3A that he was a worthy winner of SA's Volunteer Tutor of the Year in the 2008 Adult Learners' Week awards.

In October three Lower North members attended the 3-day Rendezvous hosted by U3A Adelaide Hills. Every U3A in the State was represented at this relaxed, fun, well-run event. We had a ball though I must admit our activity choices were heavy on Hahndorf's history and garden visits rather than purely U3A stuff. We couldn't resist the opportunity to visit Gardening Australia's Sophie Thompson. We could identify with this relatively new garden established in a former cow paddock. It is set up to produce food for her family and frame the lovely stone cottage which they have renovated from a ruin. Her hospitality extended to allowing us all to tramp through her kitchen, picking up delicious home-made cake and plum cordial on the way. Yum.

Another stand out was Stangate House and its 4 acres of internationally recognised camellia garden. The dappled shade of this peaceful garden dipping down to a stone channel encased running stream was a hot day haven. The 1940s heritage-listed house sits eerily empty just waiting to be brought to life by groups such as ours, invading it for Devonshire tea brought promptly by National Trust volunteers.

In 2021 it will be a totally different approach as U3A Tea Tree Gully has offered to be the hosts. It will focus more on U3A activities and mainly take place at their own campus (the 10 classroom former Modbury South Primary School) even down to the catering.

Hopefully more of our members will attend because in 2023 it might be time for U3A Lower North to host.
